## Jolino Beserra Los Angeles, CA **Benito Juarez Park** 2014

Welded rebar skeletons, mesh and cement overcoat, ceramic and porcelain tile, custom ceramic three-inch circles, porcelain and glass penny rounds, vintage Malibu tile mural scrap, vintage subway tile, glazed pottery, ceramic mugs, dichroic glass tile.

In 2012, I was commissioned by The Trust For Public Land to create play-sculptures for a new park built in tribute to Benito Juarez, in Maywood, CA. The Oaxaca, Mexicanborn artist hails from a region where, for generations, families have created exquisitely carved and painted fantasy creatures called Alebrijes. The first mosaic sculpture is a frog relaxing on a lily pad while the other is hitching a ride on the back of a turtle. Ladded a band of custom mosaic Day of The Dead tiles around the shell of the turtle and I created eyes for all of the Alebrijes with gorgeous iridescent dichroic glass tile. Misters in the rubber flooring create a cooling spray of water for children to run through as the Alebrijes lounge nearby.
